To create each of my works for *Smell the Glove*, I prompted the diffusion model <u>Midjourney</u> with two images and some text. The images I used were digital photographs of my paintings from 2006, namely, <u>Texas Man Catches Fish With Human-Like</u> <u>Teeth</u> and <u>His Bowels Shall Be a Fountain of Truth</u>. Most of the text prompts were along the following lines:

black velvet painting, photorealistic, 3D model showcase, award winning photography, hyperdetailed, cel-shading, with a strong light from above and crisp shadows --ar 3:2 --s 1000 --c 20 --iw 2 --v 5

The codes at the end of the prompt are Midjourney-specific parameters for <u>aspect ratios</u> (--ar: self-explanatory), <u>stylize</u> (--s: amount of stylization, from 0 to 1000), <u>chaos</u> (--c: image variation, from 0 to 100), and <u>model version</u> (--v: Version 5). From the few hundred images I created using this process, I chose fourteen, which I then emailed to my contact at an <u>oil painting</u> <u>studio in Xiamen, China</u>. For a little less than \$100 per painting including shipping, five weeks later I received a roll of fourteen paintings.
