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PUBLIC OPINION: U.S. ENGAGEMENT WITH THE U.N. TO COUNTER THE INFLUENCE OF RUSSIA AND CHINA IN GLOBAL AFFAIRS

KEY FINDINGS

- 1. When asked about a unilateral approach, almost a third of adults feel the U.S. should be actively countering China (32%) and Russia (31%) when it comes to their influence on global affairs, while another third of adults believe the U.S. should remain neutral (China: 29%, Russia: 31%). However, a quarter of adults are unsure of how the U.S. should react in relation to both countries.
 - When it comes to China, Republicans (47%) are more likely than Democrats (22%) to say the U.S. should be actively countering the influence of China on global affairs.
- 2. Of those who believe the U.S. should actively counter the influence of Russia or China in global affairs, strong majorities say it is <u>very important</u> (Russia: 70%, China: 71%).
- 3. When asked about a multilateral approach, over two-thirds of adults (67%) say it is important for the U.S. to engage at the United Nations to counter the influence of Russia and China, including a majority of Democrats (71%) and Republicans (71%).

METHODOLOGY

This poll was conducted between January 22-January 23, 2022 among a sample of 2211 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on gender, educational attainment, age, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.

When asked what approach the U.S. should take when it comes to countries like Russia and China, almost a third of adults feel the U.S. should be actively countering China (32%) and Russia (31%) when it comes to their influence on global affairs, while another third of adults believe the U.S. should remain neutral (China: 29%, Russia: 31%). A quarter of adults are unsure on both.





How important is it, if at all, for the U.S. to be engaged at the United Nations to counter the influence of countries like Russia and China?




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RUSSIA/CHINA POLL
