Academic Growth: Grades: 9-12

Engineering for the Cascadia Earthquake Dates: August 9-August 20

Description: (0.5 credit) Each of the activities would expand students' understanding of Civil Engineering and Material Science through hands-on engagement and demonstrations. Outdoor Science #1

Water testing, soil sampling, flora and fauna identification.

Forestry Camp for High School

Grades: 9-12

Location: North Salem High School **Description:** (0.5 credit) Forestry Field Camp is a four-week adventure into Oregon's forests. Get outside and learn the skills and techniques scientists and professionals use to study woodland environments. Explore the ecological, social, and ecological values forests provide through hands-on activities. Use multiple media to document and share your experiences.

Writing for College, Career, and Civic Readiness

Thanks to community members like you, we can continue to provide food to our network of Food Pantries throughout Marion and Polk counties.

Warehouse volunteers support our warehouse team in the following areas:

Actions Center: sort and repack donated food into family sized amounts for our partners.

<u>Retail Recovery</u>: Sort and repack fresh produce, dairy products, and refrigerated items donated from local grocery stores to ensure only the highest quality food is distributed to our neighbors.

<u>Order Assembly</u>: Assemble orders of food for our partners by locating, tracking, and stacking cases of food onto pallets.

Due to COVID-19, we've limited our shift sizes to allow for social distancing and we require volunteers to commit to a regular, weekly shift to limit the number of individuals staff and volunteers have regular contact with.

At this time, all of our shifts are filled and we are creating a list of volunteers to contact when new shifts become available. If you would like to learn more about our on-going volunteer opportunities and be added to the list please let us know!
