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For 1-2-year experiences to engage a bridge year between structured opportunities. Often referred to as a "gap year" these are anything but a gap in experience. They are layered with unique opportunities to enhance specialized skill sets. Many professional programs will offer specific time-limited skill building programs.

Who Should Consider a Post-Graduate Bridge Year?

Someone looking to engage one or more of the following:

- Enhance your experiences and skill sets through challenging
- Become a stronger applicant for graduate school and future career options through experience
- Post-graduate Service programs allow you become an integral part a community, engage problem solving, and understand your role as a supporter and capacity builder in a new experience.

Where can I find Bridge/Gap Year Engagements?

Bridge year experiences are often derived from three core areas and reflecting on your own skill development and where your work intersects is an important driver for how you utilize these platforms for engagement.

- time-limited professional programs- includes fellowships, short-term professional development
- direct employment utilizing a position to develop direct skills
- post-graduate service short-term, minimally compensated position designed to enhance community capacity building. Typically, limited to a one to two-year commitment, with some basic living arrangements, stipend, and training.

Post Graduate positions open at a variety of times. We suggest searching for new post-graduate service positions as early as January prior to graduation, with exception for PeaceCorps that takes 6 mo-1 year.
