To encourage such developments, Acton Institute offers a range of academic grants and awards that support seminarians, graduate students, and young scholars engaged in serious reflection and research on the relationship between theology, the free market, limited government, and the rule of law.

Who is Eligible?

- Seminarians and graduate students currently enrolled to study at institutions around the world, irrespective of religious affiliation, can apply for Calihan Grants.
- Doctoral candidates and recent doctoral recipients in theology, religion, philosophy, history, law, politics, economics, or related fields can apply for the Novak Award.
