## **SB 1358**

AN ACT

AMENDING SECTION 16-134, ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES; RELATING TO QUALIFICATION AND REGISTRATION OF ELECTORS.

1 Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Arizona:  
2 Section 1. Section 16-134, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to  
3 read:

4       16-134. **Return of registrations made outside office of county**  
5       recorder; incomplete or illegible forms

6       A. A county recorder shall authorize persons to accept registration  
7 forms, shall designate places for receipt of registration forms and shall  
8 designate additional locations for distribution of voter registration  
9 forms. Public assistance agencies and disabilities agencies as defined in  
10 section 16-140 shall return or mail completed voter registrations to the  
11 county recorder of the county in which the applicant resides within five  
12 days after receipt of those registrations. **A COUNTY RECORDER MAY NOT**  
**CONDUCT A VOTER REGISTRATION DRIVE OR OTHER SIMILAR VOTER REGISTRATION**  
**EVENT AT ANY LOCATION OTHER THAN AT A LOCATION, FACILITY OR PROPERTY THAT**  
**IS GOVERNMENT OWNED.**

16       B. If the information on the registration form is incomplete or  
17 illegible and the county recorder is not able to process the registration  
18 form, the county recorder shall notify the applicant within ten business  
19 days of receipt of the registration form, shall specify the missing or  
20 illegible information and, if the missing or illegible information  
21 includes any of the information prescribed by section 16-121.01,  
22 subsection A, shall state that the registration cannot be completed until  
23 the information is supplied. If the missing or illegible information is  
24 supplied before 7:00 p.m. on election day, that person is deemed to have  
25 been registered on the date the registration was first received.

26       C. In the case of registration by mail, a voter registration is  
27 valid for an election if it complies with either of the following:

28       1. The form is postmarked twenty-nine days or more before an  
29 election and is received by the county recorder by 7:00 p.m. on the day of  
30 that election.

31       2. The registration is dated twenty-nine days or more before an  
32 election and is received by the county recorder by first class mail within  
33 five days after the last day to register to vote in that election.

34       D. The date of registration entered for registration forms that are  
35 received by the county recorder from persons, groups or agencies that are  
36 not authorized to accept registrations pursuant to subsection A of this  
37 section and that do not bear a legible postmark date or an otherwise  
38 reliable date shall be the date that those forms are received by the  
39 county recorder.
