

How to Participate in NJ High School Voter Registration Week

When: Week of April 24 – 29th

Who: All Eligible 17 and 18 Year Olds in Every High School in New Jersey

How to Participate:

- Ask your eligible 17 & 18 year old students to register to vote by using the provided QR code link to the Student Voting & Registration page in the linked flyer below.
 - o Pick a specific day or days during High School Voter Registration Week
- Choose a class or an activity that is likely to have these students in them all at once.
 (e.g. Social Studies, American History, English, Lunch, Homeroom)

• The Voter Registration Activity:

- o Run the brief 2 minute video from Secretary of State Way
- Show or distribute our provided self-guided slide presentation, <u>Be An Informed</u> New Jersey Voter
- Provide this attached program flyer to each student. The QR code on the flyer will take them to the Student Voter Registration & Voting page on the NJ Votes website. That page is also located on the NJ Voter Information Portal at Vote.NJ.Gov. The student page contains:
 - A link to the state's <u>Online Voter Registration Application</u> so students can register on the spot.
 - For those students who need it, they will also find links to their county's postage paid <u>printable paper voter registration forms</u>.
 - A link for Vote-By-Mail application forms.

Other ways schools can participate:

- Have a group of interested students set up a voter registration table. Your Social Studies, AP History or Political Science classes may want to help.
- Have your student Council Members set up a registration table. Have them ask other students to help
- Have a friendly voter registration competition with a neighboring school. The winner is the school with the highest percentage increase in total number of new registrations as a percentage of junior and senior enrollment
- Promote NJ High School Voter Registration week on your social media pages. Use hashtag #NJStudentsVote

Ways for Community Groups to Participate:
